

## Good Practices Guide now available!

Within the framework of the project, was writtern a Good Practices guide as a strategic tool aiming to enhance the transferability of good practices between countries and organizations, promoting thus the role of local communities, active citizenship, volunteerism and solidarity, and the understanding and debating of Euroscepticism.



The good practices are selected between practices taking place in the different countries that the EUBorCo project is taking place. The initial research of practices was based on desk research concerning applied practices in the fields of Refugee and Migrants Integration, especially focusing on the 2015 refugee crisis in the Eastern Mediterranean.



Additionally, the practices were selected among the showcased practices in the field visits that took place within the framework of the EUBorCo project, namely: the visit to Rocella Ionica and the visit to Malta. In the case of Greece, good practices are also based on the planned field visits within and around the Municipality of Paionia.

Among the Good Practices were: Omnes (Greece), Riace – Città Futura (Italy), NA (Malta), Drama for Change (Spain , Bulgaria, Netherlands, Germany, Ireland), Bulgarian Red Cross (Bulgaria) and Now a Refugee – Always Human (Republic of North Macedonia).
